In todays society we are inundated with information, statistics, numbers and everything from A

-Z. The stock market is up, unemployment down, data shows this, data shows that, the list goes on an on.

Well, at the Roma Lodge food booth we decided to



keep track of the data. We have approximately 300 members in Roma Lodge. Our age distribution is we have 100 members who are 60 years of age or older and 58 who are 18 or younger. So that leaves about half our members who are in the 20-59 age group.

Let's be realistic. We have a 1/3 of our members who are getting too old to work and 1/3 of our members who are too young and are still in school. The other 1/3 are busy parents who are working and too busy with their children's activities.

Michael, along with sisters *Melissa Watkins and Maci Daramy* have done an outstanding job for the past 8 years developing new menu items, being creative with marketing and credit card sales and ensuring the


It's More Than A Sausage Sandwich!
