Heralds Message

read the other day a person was lamenting the fact she spends \$80 per year on bananas only to see them get brown, stale and rotten



forcing her to throw them away.

It is estimated Americans throw away over 40% of the food we purchase. Sixty-eight percent of Americans believe that throwing away food once its expiration date passes lowers their chances of getting sick from it.

Are we getting stale as an organization?

I found this picture of a lodge float members constructed in 1992 for the Visalia Columbus Day

Parade. It depicted one of the Christopher Columbus ships used in the discovery of America in 1492. At this year's Columbus Day Celebration we could not find a member to chair the event, had only 28 adult members attend and it would be difficult to find any connection of the activity to Christopher Columbus.

We have 302 members of Roma Lodge and we only

had 28 of our adult members attend! After 526 years has Columbus lost his importance for Roma Lodge?

We have had a constant barrage from groups who want to do away with the Columbus Day holiday in favor of a Indigenous Peoples day. In fact the city of Columbus, Ohio just did away with their holiday citing budget cuts. Really? No Columbus Holiday in Columbus, Ohio! Go Figure!

Granted this year we had increased competition with other community events such as the Fatima Celebration and the International Agri-Center Harvest Festival on the weekends we had to celebrate Columbus Day. So maybe it is time we did something different to increase participation for the event. As they say, if you do what you have

always done, the event will be what it has always been! In this case it is becoming less and less of an event each year.

Maybe it is time we took a look at what we are doing as an organization and make some changes for the future. As we elect a new slate of officers we need to develop our program of meetings and activities to determine what we keep, what needs to be modified and what we no longer do.

There are those who may say our members are getting too old and we just can't do what we used to do. Our lodge demographics show that we have 28 of our members who are 80 years of age or older, 38 age 70 to 79, 40 age 60-69 and 66 age 40 to 59. Therefore, over half of our membership (170 members) are 40 years of age or older. That leaves 132 under the age of 40. They could provide a powerful force for our organization if we could get them involved and attend lodge activities.

We need to listen to our younger members and solicit their input as to how we can get more of their generation involved in lodge activities. For those of us who attended the Columbus Day event we all had a great time, the food was great and the bocce tournament was a lot of fun. Maybe we need to pick a different time, date or venue for the event. Let's ask their advice in how we can get more of them involved.

We have a good start with our junior members now that Pam Sola is providing leadership for them. Perhaps we need to provide more activities for our juniors such as trips or activities just for junior members.

In January you will again be asked to pay your annual dues. Will you pay your \$75 and like those bananas allow your membership in Roma Lodge to become stale and just throw those dollars away? Or will you benefit from your membership by attending meetings and lodge activities and becoming an active member of the lodge. We are asking for your input on how the lodge can reorganize itself to get more members involved. The choice is yours!
